A search to drug allergy in PubMed generates more than 30,000 hits, whereas insect allergy yields 3,000 and food allergy gives rise to almost 11,000 hits. A close look to the PubMed results demonstrates that those hits indeed refer to drug hypersensitivity. Interestingly, even the search strategy to allergic asthma or allergic rhinitis does not yield so many hits. Although a very rough estimate a PubMed search gives an impression of the importance of the area.

The aim of EAACI is to promote education, training, exchange of knowledge and research in the field of Allergology and Clinical Immunology. One of my personal goals is to strengthen Clinical Allergy, the domain that comprises areas such as drug hypersensitivity, food allergy, insect allergy and immunotherapy. From this perspective endorsement of the third international meeting on drug hypersensitivity (DHM3) is a logical step. We are happy to support this meeting, as we did previously. We also value the continuous efforts of the EAACI Interest Group on Drug Allergy, chaired by Pascal Demoly to bring drug allergy to the attention of the medical community. 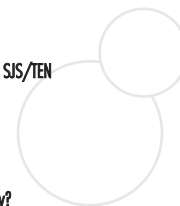
